Our 2022 Annual Report is here!



CHILD WELFARE

IN 2022 YOU SHOWED ORPHANED AND ABANDONED CHILDREN THEY WERE NOT ALONE.

In 2022, you helped to keep hope happening for over 50 children in our care at the House of Moses and the Bryant crisis nursery. While waiting for a permanent home, vulnerable children were given loving care, warm blankets and nutritious meals. With your help we not only were able to care for abandoned and vulnerable children, but to stop family separation at the source! Thanks to your giving, our family preservation and empowerment program supported materially poor mothers to learn income generating skills and to create small businesses that sell handmade peanut butter, locally grown fruit, rugs and more!

With additional and sustainable income, mothers can afford to keep their babies at home and prevent the potential of giving them up to an institution. Families that were previously eating one meal a day were able to double or triple the amount of meals they consume and create a sustainable future for their communities. By supporting these skill building activities, you have created a pathway to a secure family for children inside and outside our crisis nurseries.

Thanks in part to your giving, every bed at the House of Moses will one day be empty and instead, households across Zambia will be filled with children in loving, secure families free from the fear of hunger, separation and social isolation.

FAMILY PRESERVATION & EMPOWERMENT

IN 2022 YOU PROTECTED CHILDREN AND FAMILIES EXPERIENCING HUNGER.

You may remember Chanda from our spring campaign last year. She is a mother, grandmother and caregiver to eight children. Prior to entering our program, Chanda was sustaining her family solely on the income of her husband. She filled the gaps by relying on the generosity of her neighbors who shared what little they had to make sure she and her family were cared for. Due to rising food costs her support was spread thin. Chanda worries most about the youngest children in her family who are under five. Children in this age group are the most vulnerable as they are more likely to suffer long term negative effects like certain health conditions, and problems in school and social situations.

However, with your help last year, Chanda was able to start a fruit stand selling local produce, cooking oil and handmade rugs. "If it weren't for you, my grandchildren would have died." she stated. Now she is able to contribute to the household earnings and help her family not only survive but thrive. When we last spoke to Chanda, she was planning a birthday celebration for her eldest grandchild. We are claiming many more celebrations for her family and many like hers in Zambia. Thank you for being a part of this global story and moving towards a sustainable future, and keeping families together.

EDUCATION

IN 2022 YOU HELPED ENSURE A BRIGHT FUTURE FOR CHILDREN STRUGGLING WITH SCHOOL FEES.

Cynthia, you may remember, is a child who attends one of our FaithWorks schools in Zambia. At eleven years old, she has high hopes for herself. She loves mathematics and hopes to one day become a lawyer. Cynthia is one of many children in Zambia whose families survive on less than a dollar per day.

Prior to attending Faithworks schools, Cynthia's family was challenged with paying school fees at public school, buying uniforms and buying books. When Cynthia began attending FaithWorks schools, which are completely free, her family was relieved from the financial burden of school fees and able to use these funds for other necessities like food and housing costs.

Free school lunch helped Cynthia and her classmates stay focused on their studies all year long and continue to perform at the highest percentile in the region. In the past, attending a free community school was stigmatized in Zambia, but because of the quality education that FaithWorks schools provide, our students wear it as a badge of honor.

With nearly half of Zambia's population aged under 18, Cynthia and students like her represent the future. You have helped ensure that this future is a bright one.

ACE TRANSITION PARTNERS CELEBRATED ITS THIRD YEAR OF EXPANDING FAMILY-BASED CARE WORLDWIDE.

The consulting arm of our organization, ACE Transition Partners helps guide institutions transitioning to family based care with a custom plan tailored to their unique needs. Material poverty for many children and families snowballs into family separation, loss and social exclusion. By addressing issues at the source, our partners can change the outcomes for thousands of children in Sub-Saharan Africa and beyond.

As the pioneers of the family-based care movement in Zambia, last year we offered our expertise to partners in nearly a dozen regions and were able to impact the lives of 25,000 more children.

Please read on for an update from one of our partners on the ground in Sub-Saharan Africa:

"On Thursday, February 24th the invasion of Ukraine began. On Monday morning, February 28th, Alliance for Children Everywhere called to offer their support towards our efforts serving vulnerable children and families in Ukraine. As a kindred spirit and sister organization serving in different geographical areas, we are and continue to be humbled and inspired by ACE's


immediate graciousness and generosity to help during a time when it was needed most by our team and partners.

SEVEN SCHOOLS EVENTS

Last year we piloted a new campaign to help renovate each of our seven FaithWorks schools in Zambia. In seven major cities across the United States (Seattle, Portland, Los Angeles, Grand Rapids, Tucson, Houston, Atlanta) we held seven in-person events. You listened and learned about all the ways that God is working on the ground in Zambia and what more is in store.

As our FaithWorks schools help students perform at a high percentile, the demand is evergrowing to enroll. Last year, you helped break ground on new classrooms to accommodate more students, fences to secure school campuses, build new restrooms and give access to electricity to each of our community schools. Education is a globally recognized solution to help solve poverty and through your giving, vulnerable children in Zambia today can become the changemakers of tomorrow.

With rising food costs and economic instability, you also helped us raise the salaries of teachers who not only are educators but role models, confidants, and advocates for our students. Many students in our FaithWorks schools have felt so touched by our programs that upon graduation, they themselves return to their alma mater not as students, but as teachers. Thank you for keeping the chain of change-making going, and helping to expand the reach of quality education to some of the most materially poor children in Zambia.
